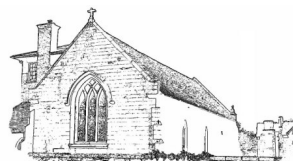

Please **DO NOT LEAVE MONEY IN THE PORCH!**



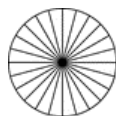
Next **SUNDAY the 9TH OF FEBRUARY**, the Catholic Church in England and Wales will celebrate **RACIAL JUSTICE**. The theme is :**'YOU ARE AT THE HEART OF THE CHURCH'**. It will celebrate the contribution Travelling Communities make to the Church in England and Wales. It is an opportunity for all Catholics to pray for, reflect on and respond to Racial Justice matters within the Church and wider society. Racial Justice Sunday should encourage proactive discussions on overt and covert forms of racism experienced by fellow Catholics from the travelling communities. To support the Church in its work with travellers, a second collection will be taken at both Masses next Sunday. Your contribution, however great or small will help to make a difference.

Answers to some frequently asked questions about the **50 HOURS OF PRAYER for Fr John:**

- The chart is on a table in the porch
- Each spoke of the wheel represents 60 minutes, divided in to two parts so you may choose either 30 minutes or a full 60 minutes
- When, how, where you choose to pray is entirely up to you ... no one will be checking up!
- You may choose to build the time you are promising with five or ten minutes here or there, whenever and wherever you prefer
- You don't have to write your name on the spoke if you don't want to but please write something in the space eg 'Anon' or a message for Fr John.



February 11 is **WORLD DAY OF THE SICK**, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

In our Deanery, Mass will be celebrated on **SATURDAY 8 FEBRUARY** with Mass at St Ambrose Church, Kidderminster at 12 noon. The homily will be given by the Revd Christopher Blackman, a Deacon at St George's, Worcester, who is part of the Chaplaincy team at Worcester Royal Hospital. During Mass the Sacrament of the Sick will be celebrated.

Prayers for Sick:

If you wish to have your name or that of a friend or relative to be included in the prayers for the sick read aloud in Mass each Sunday please tell Fr John or send him a message by phone, note or email.

If however you would like to have names printed in the weekly newsletter (in addition to them being read aloud) **please complete a consent form (printed on yellow paper, to be found in a plastic wallet attached to the notice board in the porch)** and either hand it to Fr John, post through his front door or send by mail.

We need to make sure that you or your friend or family member have consented to their name being published on that list and we must take proper care of your information and complies with current data protection law. Please be aware, the list printed on the newsletter can be seen by a lot of people as it is put up on the noticeboards at church, is available for anyone to pick up in church and is also published on the internet through the parish website.

Home visits:

There are also blank letters available (printed on blue paper, to be found in a plastic wallet attached to the notice board in the porch) to offer to anyone who may want prayers, visits or any other support from the parish whilst they are not well.
