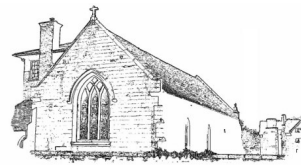

Q: Why are all parishes throughout the world asked to support
World Mission Sunday?

A: World Mission Sunday is vital to the growth of the Church and the spread of the Gospel in predominately impoverished and remote areas overseas. The funds raised build much-needed infrastructure, from chapels and schools to orphanages, clinics and dispensaries. Requested by the local community, the support from Missio transforms lives and creates a hub from which the young Church can flourish and grow. **World Mission Sunday is one of only three Papal collections and has been especially chosen by the Holy Father to support the mission of the Church in the world.**

Q: How do I donate to the World Mission Sunday collection to?

A: The parish will send donations and all completed Gift Aid envelopes to Missio. Cheques from parishioners, made out to World Mission Sunday or Missio, will be sent directly to Missio together with the parish collection.
