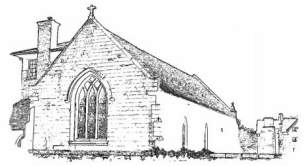

WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY 2020

falls on 24 May as much of the world remains in lockdown as we attempt to recover from the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic. The way we communicate in situations of self-isolation and separation has shifted from hand shaking, hugging and close contact to encounters through phone, tablet and computer screens. The virtual has replaced the physical.

Coronavirus has had a profound impact on our prayer and worship. We are currently unable to pray in our churches. As lockdown eases, we will return to kneel in the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. It may be second best to worshipping in church, but over 400 parishes in England & Wales are streaming Catholic Mass live online.

Pope Francis

On 1 April Pope Francis invited us to pray for “those who work in the media, who work to communicate today so that people are not isolated... who help us to bear this time of isolation.” He recognises that given a growing digital culture throughout the world, the media must become a primary platform for spreading the Gospel. He also said: “Studying new ways and means to communicate the Gospel of mercy to all people, in the heart of different cultures, through the media that the new digital cultural context makes available to our contemporaries is something that is very much in my heart.”

Theme

The theme of the day, decided prior to the global challenge that has gripped us, is devoted to storytelling.

“That you may tell your children and grandchildren” (Ex 10:2)

The Pope’s World Communications Day message focuses on storytelling, truth and who we are in God’s eyes. He looks to the Bible as “the great love story between God and humanity” with Jesus at its centre.

Pope Francis encourages us to remember “who and what we are in God’s eyes” and invites us to entrust ourselves to the Virgin Mary “who knew how to untie the knots of life with the gentle strength of love.”

COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

Monday 25th: Memorial of St Bede the Venerable, Priest, Doctor of the Church

Bede died in 573, a monk of Jarrow. He was a great scholar and wrote the Ecclesiastical History of the English People, gaining him the title 'The Father of English History'. He is patron of English writers and historians. Bede was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1899 by Pope Leo XIII

Tuesday 26th : Memorial of St Philip Neri, Priest

Philip died in 1559. Having undergone a profound conversion he became a priest in Rome. He founded the Congregation of the Oratory and had a great love for all people, no matter their status in life.

Wednesday 27th: Feast of St Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop

Augustine was sent by Pope Gregory the Great to establish the Faith in England. Though previous missionaries had evangelised in England, notably the Celtic saints, it was Augustine who has become known as the Apostle of England. He was the first Archbishop of Canterbury. He died in 605. In 2010 this celebration was raised to the rank of Feast.

Friday 29th: Memorial of St Paul VI, Pope

St. Paul VI was canonized and added to the liturgical calendar on January 25, 2019, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. Giovanni Battista Montini was born on September 26, 1897, in a village near Brescia Concesio. On May 29, 1920, he was named Archbishop of Milan. He became Pope on June 21, 1963. He presided over the completion of the Second Vatican Council. He died on August 6, 1978.
