Sunday 31st May DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

Throughout the Season of Easter, the first reading at Mass is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. Luke tells the story of the early Church from the Ascension and Pentecost to the early missions of the apostles.

When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church. Then "the Church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun." As the "convocation" of all men for salvation, the Church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them. *Catechism 767*

Those who with God's help have welcomed Christ's call and freely responded to it are urged on by love of Christ to proclaim the Good News everywhere in the world. This treasure, received from the apostles, has been faithfully guarded by their successors. All Christ's faithful are called to hand it on from generation to generation, by professing the faith, by living it in fraternal sharing, and by celebrating it in liturgy and prayer. *Catechism 3*

COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

Monday 1 June: Memorial of Mary

This celebration was instituted in 2018 and then added to the General Roman Calendar. The Decree states: 'This celebration will help us to remember that growth in Christian life must be anchored to the Mystery of the Cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic Banquet and to the Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed, Virgin who makes her offering to God.'

Tuesday 2 June: Memorial of Ss Marcellinus and Peter, Martyrs

Marcellinus and Peter were martyred under Diocletian and they are included in the Roman Canon.

Wednesday 3 June: Memorial of Ss Charles Lwanga & Companions, Martyrs

Between 1885 and 1887 there was a fierce persecution of Christians in Uganda. St Charles and his 21 companions were among many martyrs for the faith. They are the proto-martyrs of Africa.

Thursday 4 June: Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Eternal High Priest

The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, according to the order of Melchizedek. In him the Father has been well pleased from before all time. As Mediator between God and human beings, fulfilling his Father's will, he sacrificed himself once on the altar of the Cross as a saving Victim for the whole world. Thus instituting the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice, with a brother's kindness he chose, from among the children of Adam, men to augment the priesthood, so that, from the sacrifice continually renewed in the Church, streams of divine power might flow, whereby a new heaven and a new earth might be made, and throughout the whole universe there would be perfected what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor has entered into the human heart.

Friday 5 June: Memorial of St Boniface, Bishop, Martyr

Born in Devon about 675, Boniface was martyred in the Netherlands in 754. He was a great evangeliser, known as the Apostle of Germany for his missionary zeal and is said to have died whilst ministering the sacrament of Confirmation.

Saturday 6 June: Memorial of St Norbert, Bishop

Born in Germany in 1080, Norbert assiduously pursued a life of empty pleasures. Around 1115 he had a conversion experience, which changed his life: he became a priest and began preaching. The manner of his life attracted others to accompany him, and the Premonstratensian (or Norbertine) Order was begun. He later became an Archbishop and died in 1134.
