

## EVERY DAY IS SUNDAY!

During these times of restriction, the obligation to attend Mass each Sunday is suspended. We are encouraged by the Church to stagger our attendance at Mass to include weekdays to avoid over-capacity on Sunday.

- As space is limited, please book in to attend Mass **IN CHURCH** on **Saturday and Sunday** only. ([stmarysrc.harvington@gmail.com](mailto:stmarysrc.harvington@gmail.com)).
- Masses in church **on other days** or in the garden **do not need to be booked** in advance.

In order to make attendance a comfortable and safe experience we all need to follow some basic guidelines:

- To comply with the '1 metre plus' guidance advice for safe social distancing, everyone who attends St Mary's (church or garden) must
  - maintain a **one metre distance** from members of other households and
  - **wear a face mask or similar face covering (these will not be provided, please bring your own).**
  - For your safety and the safety of others we ask all visitors **use the hand sanitiser provided on entry.**
  - When planning any visit to St Mary's in the coming weeks please be aware, **we are unable to allow the use of the lavatory.**
  - In order to track and trace, should a case of Covid-19 be found, **all visitors** to either the inside of St Mary's or the garden **will be asked to leave their name and contact details with us.** These will be held securely in accordance with GDPR rules.
- Everyone who attends Mass in the garden is asked to please
  - **not arrive before 10.00am**
  - **provide their own chair**, preferably with a low back to avoid blocking sight lines. Visitors may wish to stand or sit on the ground/their own rug or mat. For reasons of hygiene, **no parish seating will be provided.**



## COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

### **Monday 13 July**

#### **Memorial of St Henry**

Henry II, Duke of Bavaria (973-1024) , was crowned Emperor in 1014. He used his power to extend the kingdom of God by promoting missionary work.

### **Tuesday 14 July**

#### **Memorial of St Camillus de Lellis**

St Camillus de Lellis (1550 - 1641) came from a noble family of Chieti, Italy. Camillus was a young soldier of fortune when he decided to consecrate his life to the service of the sick. He improved the treatment and care of hospital patients. He founded the order of Hospitallers which carries his name.

### **Wednesday 15 July**

#### **Memorial of St Bonaventure, Bishop, Doctor of the Church**

St Bonaventure was born in Italy. He entered the Franciscan Order. At the University of Paris where he was a lecturer, he met St Thomas Aquinas. He became the General of the Franciscan Order and a Cardinal. Known as the 'Seraphic Doctor', he is considered the greatest exponent of mystical theology in the Middle Ages.

### **Thursday 16 July**

#### **Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel**

The cult of Mary under this title originated in the 14<sup>th</sup> century and came to be observed throughout the west during the 18<sup>th</sup> century. This feast commemorates the Virgin Mary as associated with Mount Carmel (Israel), site of the prophet Elijah's altar to the one true God and of the 12<sup>th</sup> century eremitical forerunners of the Carmelites. Mary is celebrated on this day as a model of reflection, solitude and prayer.

### **Friday 17 July**

#### **Memorial of St Kenelm, Prince of Mercia**

Kenelm was the prince of Mercia in the ninth century. Following his death, the village of Clent, Worcestershire, became a centre of his cult.
