To comply with the '1 metre plus' advice for safe social distancing please:

## **COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK:**



### **Monday 21 September, Feast of St Matthew, Apostle, Evangelist**

Saint Matthew: born at Capernaum. He was a tax-gatherer when called by Jesus. He wrote his Gospel in the Hebrew language, and tradition has it that he preached the Faith in the East.

### **Wednesday 23 September, Memorial of St Pio or Pietrelcina**

Saint Pius of Pietrelcina: Born on 25 May 1887, at the age of sixteen he entered the novitiate of the Capuchin Friars and was ordained priest in 1910. His ministry displays a remarkable devotion to prayer and the sacraments. He also committed himself to relieving the pain of many families, chiefly through the foundation of the "House for the Relief of Suffering". He died in 1968.


### **Thursday 24 September, Memorial of Our Lady of Walsingham**

The lady of the manor of Walsingham, Richeldis de Faverches, was instructed by a vision of the Virgin Mary to build in her village an exact replica of the house of Nazareth in which the Annunciation had taken place. The vision occurred, according to tradition, in 1061. The original house was destroyed at the Reformation, but during the 19th and early 20th centuries pilgrimage to Walsingham was revived.

### **Saturday 26 September, Memorials of Ss Cosmos and Damian, Martyrs**

Saints Cosmas & Damian: according to ancient tradition, Cosmas and Damian were doctors who were martyred in Syria around 300. There is evidence that their tomb was at Cyrrhus, where a basilica was built in their honour.

## COLLECTION FOR THE HOLY PLACES:



Every year on Good Friday, a collection is taken up in Catholic Churches around the world to support the work of the Franciscans working in the Holy Land. However, this year due to the coronavirus pandemic measures in place throughout the world, many people could not attend Holy Week liturgies, causing the postponement of the collection until September. Pope Francis has said that within the context the world is living, [the donation] is a "sign of hope and

solidary nearness to the Christians who live in the land where God became man, died and rose for us."

The annual collection, one of the main sources of support for the mission of the Custody of the Holy Land, is used for schools and to support Christians, creating job opportunities and providing them with a welcoming home. In this way, local Christians are helped to remain in this land, to live their faith with courage.

The Franciscan friars also work to preserve and maintain the Holy Sites where the Incarnate Lord lived during his earthy life, and to allow Christians from all parts of the world to come to these places to pray and revive their faith, and to be blessed by the stones and the earth that Jesus Christ touched.

Speaking about the current situation since the outbreak of Covid-19, the Custos of the Holy Land, Fr Francesco Patton, OFM, said "unfortunately, since the beginning of the pandemic there are no pilgrims... we are a small minority here in the Holy Land and, in fact, we live thanks to the help and support of the whole world. And I repeat the pandemic has in a certain way cut off that normal relationship with Christians from around the world that comes about through pilgrimages." The Custos explained that because pilgrimages have suffered as a result of the pandemic, Christians who work in the hospitality and tourism sectors, as well as those who run gift shops that sell souvenirs in olive wood, have been hard hit by the present situation. He expressed the hope that pilgrims would be able to return to the Holy Land soon, so that these Christian workers can return to their jobs.

### **The Lord loves a cheerful giver**

Fr Patton said it was important people give according to their means, but also with a generosity of heart. "It's true the Lord loves a cheerful giver, and it's also true, as is recalled in the Acts of the Apostles, that there's more joy in giving than in receiving", he said.
