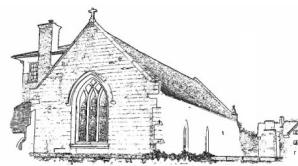

GOVERNEMENT ADVICE UPDATED ON 24th September 2020.

The UK is currently experiencing a public health emergency as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. The transmission of COVID-19 is thought to occur mainly through respiratory droplets generated by coughing and sneezing, and through contact with contaminated surfaces. The predominant modes of transmission are assumed to be droplet and contact.

Places of worship play an important role in providing spiritual leadership for many individuals, and in bringing communities and generations together. However, their communal nature also makes them places that are particularly vulnerable to the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19).

Whilst engaging in an activity in the place of worship or surrounding grounds, all parties should adhere to social distancing guidelines at all times. This means people should be 2 metres apart or more than 1 metre apart as well as taking extra steps to stay safe (such as wearing face coverings) to reduce the risk of transmission.

We are doing all we can at St Mary's to reduce the chances of infection for everyone using the premises. To allow us to continue offering five Masses per week we must all cooperate with the guidelines set out by the Government and the advice given by the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales.

YOU ARE THEREFORE REMINDED OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Please wear **a face mask or similar covering** when on the premises. **A 2 METRE distance from other households is preferable.** A limited number of places are available inside the church where a 1 METRE has been allowed for. Please sit where directed by the stewards.
- **Use the hand sanitiser** provided on entry to the church or garden.
- In order to track and trace, should a case of Covid-19 be found, **all visitors will be asked to leave their name and contact details with us.** These will be held securely in accordance with GDPR rules.
- To attend Mass in the garden please
 - **Do not arrive before 10.00am**
 - **Do provide your own chair**, preferably with a low back to avoid blocking sight lines. Visitors may wish to stand or sit on the ground/their own rug or mat. For reasons of hygiene, **no parish seating will be provided.**
 - Please sit where directed by the stewards.
- The lavatory is currently closed to all visitors.
- As space is limited inside church, please book in to attend Mass on **Saturday and Sunday** only (stmarysrc.harvington@gmail.com). For these two Masses you will be allocated a place on a seating plan. Please sit where directed by the stewards.

Father Hudson's reaches out to people of all ages who need help, advice, and support at times of adversity. Please give generously to this worthy cause.

Father Hudson's Care works across the Archdiocese of Birmingham to support people at their time of greatest need.

Children, young people and families flourish following the support, help and care from Family Support Workers who are there for them when they are needed most. Youngsters unable to live with their birth families blossom and grow through the love, care and support offered by trained, experienced and dedicated foster carers, specially matched with them by New Routes Fostering. Adults affected by a childhood separation from their family of origin find support and answers through our Origins Service.

People with disabilities, sensory impairments or learning difficulties are seen first for the person they are, not for the disability they have or the wheelchair they may use. Inclusivity and accessibility are not just words at Father Hudson's; they are a way of life. People find the care, understanding and support they need to live their lives on equal terms and to the full at St Vincent's apartments, in the community, and in St Catherine's Bungalows and Day Service. Older people and those living with various types of dementia find a home from home in St Joseph's, a residential community in Coleshill, North Warwickshire.

People experiencing homelessness are seen as people first, with all their strengths, talents and ambitions. They feel recognised, valued and empowered to make a fresh start. Refugees and asylum seekers find welcome in caring communities, and vulnerable older people feel connected, happier and healthier thanks to Father Hudson's Care and its community partners. All this is achieved thanks to the prayerful support of the Church through parishes and parishioners in the Archdiocese of Birmingham.
