HEALTH and SAFETY notice:

We are doing all we can at St Mary's to reduce the chances of virus infection for everyone using the premises. To continue Masses at St Mary's at this time we must all cooperate with the guidelines set out by the Government and the advice given by the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales.

- Please wear a **face mask or similar covering** when on the premises.

- Please note, the lavatory is currently closed to all visitors.

The practice of providing material support to those charged with preaching the Gospel, thus enabling them to devote themselves completely to their apostolic mission and to care for those in greatest need, is as old as Christianity itself (cf. *Acts* 4:34, 11:29). By the end of the eighth century the Anglo-Saxons felt so closely linked to the Bishop of Rome that they decided to send a regular annual contribution to the Holy Father. It was thus that the *Denarius Sancti Petri* (Alms of Saint Peter) originated and spread throughout Europe.
