FEASTS AND MEMORIALS COMMEMORATED THIS WEEK

Wednesday 20 July

Memorial of St Apollinaris (First or second century) St Apollinaris may have been a native of Antioch. He eventually became first bishop of Ravenna, Italy. He was tortured and martyred for the faith and his cult became popular in many places.

Thursday 21 July Memorial of St Lawrence of Brindisi (1559-1619)

St Lawrence was Italian and a Capuchin of great culture.

A teacher and writer of theology, he preached in many regions of Europe and died in Lisbon.





Friday 22 July Feast of St Mary Magdalene

She was one of the few who remained with Christ during His agony on the cross. With two other women she went to His tomb and found it empty. It was to her that Our Lord first appeared after His Resurrection. He asked her to announce His Resurrection to the Apostles.

Saturday 23 July Feast of St Bridget (1303-1373)

St Bridget was born in Sweden. She was the mother of eight children whom she brought up in a very Christian manner, one of whom was St Catherine of Sweden. After her husband's death, she dedicated herself to an ascetic and contemplative life.

As a Franciscan Tertiary, she founded a religious order.

She wrote many works on ascetical and mystical concepts. She died in Rome.
