A pilgrimage of the **relics of Saint Bernadette** of Lourdes, Bernadette Soubirous, is coming to the Archdiocese of Birmingham this October.

The remains of Saint Bernadette are preserved in a shrine in the town of Nevers, 700 kilometres north of Lourdes. A section of bone from Saint Bernadette's thigh will be taken to major cathedrals and churches of the dioceses of England, Scotland and Wales as part of a national pilgrimage. The relics will be visiting St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham, Our Lady of Lourdes in Hednesford and the Immaculate Conception in Bicester over the weekend of **7 - 10 October**. A dedicated website on the national tour has been launched for the occasion. It contains details of 'The Tour', 'St Bernadette', 'What Are Relics?', 'Continuing the Journey' and much more. Registration is now open, to book your encounter with the Relics of St Bernadette please visit the Registration page on the dedicated website **https://stbernadette.org.uk/**. There is no charge for registration; to ensure the comfort and safety of pilgrims, visitors are asked to register to attend with a dedicated timeslot. Please note that registering your time slot helps the venue understand expected visitor numbers - it is not a timed ticket, and entry to the venues will be by queuing.

On 25th September the second collection will be for Father Hudson's Care to support their mission of supporting vulnerable people across the Archdiocese of Birmingham. Father Hudson's reaches out to people of all ages who need help, advice, and support at times of adversity.

Please give generously to this worthy cause.

Since 1902 Father Hudson's Care has worked across the Archdiocese to help people in need. Our work is supported by parishes through a second collection in September. This year your support is needed more than ever, in the past year we have continued to be there for people in need but we have had to make changes to many of our services to keep people safe.

Last year, Tabor Cottage was opened to provide move-on accommodation for guests of Tabor House. Tabor Cottage offers guests more independence and time to secure a permanent home, while still being able to access support from staff and volunteers at Tabor House.

St Joseph's Residential Care Home opened a dedicated visiting pod creating a new comfortable place for safe in-person visits. The Family Support Service launched a crisis fund to support the families that we work with to overcome barriers to children's well-being and educational attainment. Maryvale Community Project provides popular lunch clubs to reduce loneliness and isolation for older people and those with learning disabilities.

This is just some of the work that is undertaken and with the support of parishes and parishioners Fr Hudson's Care can continue to be there for people in need.<u>https://www.fatherhudsons.org.uk/</u>
