THURSDAY 8 SEPTEMBER Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8

date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8. Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child that will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation and asks for an increase of peace.

FRIDAY 9 SEPTEMBER

Memorial of St Osburg, Abbess (c1016) St Osburg was the first abbess of the nunnery founded by King Canute at Coventry. She worked to care for the poor and vulnerable of the city. Her cult was confirmed in the fifteenth century, but she may be a saint of a much earlier date.

Memorial of St Peter Claver, Priest (1580-1654) St Peter Claver was born at Verdu in Catalonia, Spain, and entered the Society of Jesus, In 1610 he was sent to Columbia and began his life's work among the slaves. He cared for them and baptised more than 300,000 during his thirty-three years of tireless ministry.

SATURDAY 10 SEPTEMBER

Memorial of Blessed Agnellus of Pisa (1194-1236) Blessed Angellus was born at Pisa, Italy, and received by St Francis himself among the Friars Minor and sent by him to open a house in Paris. He was later appointed by St Francis the first Provincial of the Order in England. Angelus arrived at Dover in 1224 and founded houses at Canterbury and Oxford. He worked also for some time in London. At Oxford he established a school which because famous and it was in this city he died. His cult was confirmed in 1892.

Memorial of St Egwin, Bishop (717) The foundation of the abbey at Evesham is attributed to an eight century Bishop of Worcester called Egwin. *Diocesan Ordo 2021-2022 Archdiocese of Birmingham. Evesham, John F Neale 2021/2022*
