

On this FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING, we celebrate NATIONAL YOUTH SUNDAY in England and Wales.

It is a day where young people and their contribution to the Church is celebrated. This is also a day where the time, commitment, and love of volunteers in parishes and those involved in youth work across the diocese is celebrated.

The **second collection** in every parish on the feast of Christ the King is for the important work of the **Kenelm Youth Trust**, the Charity that provides for youth ministry in the Archdiocese of Birmingham.

In four parts, put simply, the Kenelm Youth Trust has two distinct retreat centres, Alton Castle serving young people in Key Stages 2 and 3 and Soli centre for youth ministry serving 14-25 year olds. The third element is supporting school Chaplaincy through training and support offered by the Lay Chaplain Co-ordinator. Finally, Parish Youth Ministry is supported and developed by the Birmingham Catholic Youth Service, training volunteers, communicating opportunities, offering events, pilgrimage and retreats to young people and the adults who support them.

Since September 2021 the Kenelm Trust has worked with over 10,000 young people, set to increase post-pandemic, and have facilitated the re-start of Youth Groups, Sports Events, Camping Trips, Summer Camp, Training events and local social action projects all underpinned by the amazing commitment and loyalty of Parish Youth Work volunteers and young adults who generously give of their time, energy, and talent.

All of this is supported by the second collection on World Youth Sunday each year, so we thank you for anything you can give, in advance!
