

My name is Gaynor Smith and I have recently moved to Bewdley from Coventry with my husband Martin. I am a guide at Harvington Hall, where I enjoy relating to visitors the inspiring story of the faith, hope and daring of Catholic recusant families, during the times of religious persecution.

I am a member of the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham. The Ordinariate was set up by Pope Benedict XVI in his vision of Christian unity, to help former Anglicans join the Catholic Church, bringing with them treasures of music, art and liturgy retained in the Anglican tradition.

In 2016 I joined the Benedictine Adorers of the Sacred Heart of Jesus of Montmartre, at Tyburn convent in London. As an oblate I follow the rule of St Benedict in work, prayer and study of scripture and the work of modern catholic authors, which enlightens my understanding of God's plan for us.
