



The three bank holiday during the month of May, are likely to put pressure on many families whose children will not be at school on those days and who normally receive free breakfasts and/or lunches. Our local **FOOD BANK** will be supporting these families and other service users.

As ever, the organisers and those they serve appreciate all the help they can get from those of us who can contribute. If you would like to donate food and other essentials please bring them to church and we will be deliver them on your behalf to the Food Bank collection point in Kidderminster during the week commencing **Monday 1st May**.

Currently there is a particular need for: coffee, tinned fruit, tinned spaghetti in tomato sauce, tinned meat (cold eg ham, corned beef, hot eg chicken curry, stewed steak), squash, tinned carrots and peas, jam, peanut butter, fruit juice, rice pudding, tinned potatoes, toilet rolls, deodorant, razors, shaving foam, shower gel, toothpaste, shampoo. They have plenty of baked beans and pasta in stock, so please avoid those items.

MEMORIALS and FEASTS COMMEMORATED THIS WEEK

23rd April (transferred from 23rd April)

Solemnity of St George, Martyr, Patron of England

Popular tradition presents **St George** as the knight who killed the dragon making him a symbol of a triumph of faith against the forces of evil. St George, lived shortly before Constantine's I reign. He was born into an illustrious family in Cappadocia and at a young age was raised to the ministry during Emperor Diocletian's reign. When the emperor promulgated an edict against the Christians, St George professed his faith publicly, for which he was martyred. During the crusades Richard Coeur de Lion impressed by the cult of St George, so popular in the east, made St George the Protector of England. He is a patron saint of England, Portugal, Germany, Aragon, Genoa, & Venice. His tomb is in Lod, near Tel Aviv, in Israel.

25th April - Feast of St Mark, Evangelist St Mark was one of the four writers of the Gospels, who provide us with a clear account of the life and teaching of Jesus Christ. We know St. Mark, therefore, mostly through his authorship of the second Gospel - the Gospel according to St. Mark. From elsewhere in Scripture, he is also known to have accompanied Paul and Barnabas on their journeys. From tradition, he is known to have been the secretary of St. Peter and the founder of the Church in Alexandria, Egypt.

28th April - Memorials

St Peter Chanel (1803 - 1841) was born in France a Marist missionary active in South West Pacific. He is called the apostle of Oceania where he spread the Gospel. He was martyred in 1841 for attempting to convert the king's son. Peter was canonised in 1954

St Louis Marie Grignion de Montford (1673 –1716) was a French diocesan priest with a great devotion to the Virgin Mary; he was noted for his fervent and enthusiastic preaching and apostolate. He founded an order of missionary priest, the Company of Mary, and an order of nuns, the Daughters of Wisdom. He is best known for his book *'True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary'* which like most of his writing was not properly published until the nineteenth century. St Louis was canonised in 1947.

29th April - Feast of St Catherine of Siena,

St Catherine (1347 –1380) entered the Third Order of St Dominic whilst a teenager. She was a leader in the renewal of the Religious Life, challenged Popes and was a mystic. She was a responsible instrument for the return of Pope Gregory XI from Avignon to Rome. In deed and in truth, she showed her love for God's church and the Roman Pontiff. With her short life she gave us a lesson in courage; the courage of telling the truth for love of the Church and souls. She was proclaimed patroness of Italy on 18th June 1939. In 1970 Blessed Pope Paul VI proclaimed her doctor of the Church.
