SEVERN TRENT WATER have informed us that access from the A448, Bromsgrove Road, into Harvington Hall Lane will be blocked from Tuesday 9th May for several weeks. Access to St Mary's will be via the turning into Park Lane/Harvington Hall Lane road from the A450 (nearly opposite The Dog pub). The essential work will 'roll'

from this junction up to Dobbes Lane, Chaddesley Corbett until 24th July. The Harvington Hall Lane junction will not be closed for the whole period but temporary traffic lights on the A448 will cause delays.



The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as **Vocations Sunday** or **Good Shepherd Sunday**, and is marked as the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**. The purpose of this day is to fulfil Jesus' instruction to 'Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his

harvest' (Matthew 9:38).

While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates her attention on raising up shepherds for God's people - vocations to Holy Orders (the priesthood and diaconate) and to the religious life - while encouraging all who are discerning their vocation to pray more earnestly that they may hear and respond to God's call.

### **Diocesan Prayer for Vocations**

Heavenly Father, we ask you to send labourers into your harvest.

Inspire, in the hearts of your people, vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life.

Bless our families with a spirit of generosity, so that those whom you call have the courage to give themselves to your Church in faith.

Through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The second collection today supports the Diocesan Clergy Training Fund. through which the Diocesan Vocations Office support seminarians and men in formation to be permanent deacons, as well as providing for the ongoing formation of clergy.

The Vocations Office also administer the diocesan Guild of St Stephen, supporting altar servers in their commitment to God and his people.
