COMMEMORATED THIS WEEK

Blood of Christ

Most Holy Body The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body ot and Blood of Christ.

This day was once called Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "Body of Christ." In the revised Lectionary the name for this day is expanded to reflect more completely our Eucharistic theology. This feast honours Jesus Christ, Really, Truly and Substantially Present under the appearances of bread and wine. This Presence happens through the change which the Church calls transubstantiation ("change of substance"), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me."



Tuesday 13 June Memorial of St Anthony of Padua, **Priest, Doctor of the Church**

St Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) was born in Lisbon, Portugal. A Franciscan, he was known for his profound knowledge of theology and for his power of persuasion. His preaching carried him from the north of Africa to Italy and France. He is known as

the 'Evangelical doctor' because he based all that he said on the texts of the gospels. He died in Padua.



Friday 16 June Solemnity of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

In 1675, Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that He wanted the Feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast. St. John Paul II, a great devotee of the Sacred Heart, said,

"This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all times."
