


COMMEMORATED and CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

Monday 17 July Memorial of St Kenelm, Prince of Mercia

Kenelm was said to have been a Mercian, who at the age of seven succeeded to the throne of his father, King Kenulph. He was murdered in the forest of Clent by order of his sister, Cynefrith. In medieval England he was universally venerated as a saint and martyr.





Thursday 20 July

Memorial of St Apollinaris (First or second century) St Apollinaris may have been a native of Antioch. He eventually became first bishop of Ravenna, Italy. He was tortured and martyred for the faith and his cult became popular in many places.

Friday 21 July Memorial of St Lawrence of Brindisi (1559-1619)

St Lawrence was Italian and a Capuchin of great culture.

A teacher and writer of theology, he preached in many regions of Europe and died in Lisbon.





Saturday 22 July Feast of St Mary Magdalene

She was one of the few who remained with Christ during His agony on the cross. With two other women she went to His tomb and found it empty. It was to her that Our Lord first appeared after His Resurrection. He asked her to announce His Resurrection to the Apostles.
