A key focus of work for the next few years is responding to Pope Francis' calling of a Jubilee Year in 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope.

The Holy Father has invited the whole Church

to prepare for the Jubilee in the two years prior through:

- Reflecting on the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council in 2023.
- Deepening our prayer life, with a special focus on the Lord's Prayer, in 2024.

To support the Church in England and Wales in this important initiative the Mission Directorate has produced a series of videos on the four Constitutions which reflect on the Liturgy, the Word of God, the Church and on its role in the modern world.

MEMORIALS and FEASTS THIS WEEK

Tuesday 19 September: Memorial of St Theodore of Canterbury, Bishop

St Theodore was born in Tarsus, Turkey, about 601. He was a monk in Italy who was not ordained a priest until he was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by Pope Vitalian in 666 at the age of 65. He arrived in England in 669, and for the rest of his life reorganised and reformed the life of the Church throughout the country, holding visitations and synods, establishing new dioceses and a great school at Canterbury, and reconciling divisions between those of the Celtic and those of the Roman tradition. St Theodore died in Canterbury on this day in 690.



Tuesday 19 September:

Memorial of St Januarius, Bishop, Martyr

St Januarius was bishop of Benevento, Italy. He died a martyr in Naples during the persecution of Diocletian. His dried blood contained in a phial, liquefies several times each year.



Wed 20 September: Memorial of St Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, Paul Chong Ha-sang, and companions, Martyrs. The Christian faith was introduced into Korea during the seventeenth century through the zeal of a group of laypersons. From the very beginning, these Christians suffered under terrible

persecutions which, over the course of the nineteenth century, gave the Church many martyrs. Outstanding among these was the first Korean priest and devoted pastor, Andrew Kim of Taegu, and the lay apostle, Paul Chong of Hasang. Among the Korean martyrs who struggled valiantly for Christ were bishops and priests, but for the most part they were laity, men and women, married, single, young and old.



Thursday 21 September:

Feast of St Matthew, Apostle, Evangelist.

Also called Levi, Matthew was the son of Alphaeus. He was a publican, that is a tax collector for the Romans. His profession was hateful to the Jews. Nevertheless, our Lord called him. Matthew is one of the Twelve

Apostles. The details of his evangelisation are unknown, as is of his martyrdom which perhaps took place in Persia. Tradition unanimously acknowledges him as the author of the first Gospel. His name appears among the other Apostles in the Roman Canon.



Saturday 23 September Memorial of St Pius of Pietrelcina.

St Pius, better known as Padre Pio (1887-1968) was born in Pietrelcina in Campania, Italy, and joined the Capuchin community at Morcone. Ordained in 1910, he moved six years later to San Giovanni Rotondo in the Gargano peninsula. Bearing the wounds of Christ's passion on his body, he became famous for his ministry in the confessional, his spiritual direction, and his miracles. In 1956 he opened the 'Home to Relieve

Suffering' near his friary. Despite his popularity, he faced much opposition, even from the Church authorities. He was canonised in 2002.
