

## St Mary's, Harvington is included in this book, due to be published on Wednesday 18th October.

Some of the finest Catholic churches in England and Wales are winning recognition and a new lease of life. The cream of them feature in *Another Fifty Catholic Churches to See Before You Die*. This beautifully illustrated book continues Elena Curti's exploration of historic churches, and her mission to

make them better-known and appreciated. It is a follow up to her bestselling volume, *Fifty Catholic Churches to See Before You Die* in 2020. Elena, a journalist at *The Tablet* for many years, has chosen fifty more personal favourites taken together to provide the backdrop to the story of Catholicism in England and Wales. The fifty churches are listed alphabetically by location, with history, architecture, and artistic highlights. Each has a compelling story peopled by courageous old Catholic families, visionary priests and religious orders, local patrons, and poor Irish migrants who contributed their pennies, and often their labour, to raise their places of worship. At the end of each entry Elena lists many more churches in the vicinity that are 'worth a detour'. Also included are biographical notes of the principal architects and artists, and a glossary of architectural terms.'
