Saturday 28 October Feast of Ss Simon and Jude, Apostles

Ss Simon and Jude went together as missionaries to Persia, and were martyred there, according to St Venantius Fortunatus, a poet and bishop of Poitiers in the sixth century. This may explain why so little is known about them and why they are usually put together.

In the various New Testament lists of the twelve apostles (Mt 10:2-4; Mk 3:16-19; Lk 6:14-16; Acts 1:13), the tenth and eleventh places are occupied by Simon the Zealot (also called Simon the "Cananean," the Aramaic word meaning "Zealot") and by Judas of James, also called Thaddaeus or Lebbaeus.

St. Jude. Jude is so named by Luke in his Gospel and in Acts. Matthew and Mark call him Thaddeus. He is not mentioned elsewhere in the Gospels, except of course where all the apostles are mentioned. Scholars hold that he is not the author of the Letter of Jude. Evidently because of the danger of a mix up and due to the disgrace of the named Judas Iscariot his name was shortened to "Jude" in English. St Jude is traditionally named as the patron of desperate situations; forgotten causes; hospital workers; hospitals; impossible causes; lost causes.

St Simon. Simon is not mentioned by name elsewhere in the New Testament, but he is mentioned on all four lists of the apostles. Some modern writers have used his surname "the Zealot" as a basis for conjectures associating him with the Zealot movement, a Jewish sect that represented an extreme of Jewish nationalism. For them, the messianic promise of the Old Testament meant that the Jews were to be a free and independent nation. God alone was their king, and any payment of taxes to the Romans, the very domination of the Romans, was a blasphemy against God.
