The 'Johnson Fund' was originally founded in 1710 with a small sum of money left by the Rev Daniel Fitter to provide for the needs of the clergy in sickness or old age. The Association owes its name to the first administrator who was the Rev John Johnson (1711-1739).

Through the Archdiocese of Birmingham, The Johnson Association supports retired, sick or infirm priests of the Diocese. This is done through grants that are made to them. Priests who are sick receive financial support during their period of illness. Priests who have retired apply for a discretionary grant which will support them throughout the retirement.

On the First Sunday of November there is an annual second collection in the Churches of the Archdiocese of Birmingham for the fund. Gift Aid envelopes are available. The Fund depends entirely on the charity and kindness of parishioners and Benefactors.

Update on the Situation in Gaza from "Friends of the Holy Land"

Through the media, we are all aware of the terrible situation that the citizens of Gaza are enduring.

The **FHL** are doing what it can to help. On October 23rd we were able to transfer money through our Bank of Palestine Account in Bethlehem to the Gaza Branch. That money was then distributed to the "Holy Family" Latin Church and the Greek Orthodox Church of St. Porphyrious to help support the hundreds of Christian and Muslim families sheltering there. Supplies of food and medicine were bought and, although they had stockpiled some of the latter, more was needed. We already give help to both these churches regularly.

Our Patrons, both Catholic and Anglican Bishops, have also donated money and have used our Account to enable them to transfer funds to Gaza.

Father Gabriel, the Parish Priest of "Holy Family", told us that nearly 700 people were sheltering there and that he was baptising all the new born babies out of fear for their lives.

Many more have sought refuge at St. Porphyrious where a building in the Complex was bombed with 18 deaths. The Rosary Sisters and the Sisters of Charity are caring for 50 disabled children, sick elderly people and, since the Anglican Hospital was bombed, many injured as well. These cannot be moved to South Gaza.

When this war is over, there will be much to do in reconstruction and to persuade the Christians to stay. There are now only 47000 left in the whole of the Holy Land, the land where Our Lord walked, taught and preached. The FHL Mission is to keep that presence there.

There will be a Second Collection <u>next Sunday, 12th November</u> to help the FHL continue its support for the people of Gaza.
