the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. The children will receive each of the sacraments for the first time on the weekend of 1st & 2nd of June this year.




COMMEMORATED THIS WEEK



Friday 1 March Feast of St David, Bishop, Patron of Wales

St David was born in South Wales around the year 600. We know very little of his life; tradition says he founded a monastery in Mynyw (Menevia) and was consecrated bishop. He lived an austere life. Many Welsh monasteries claim him as founder. His cult spread quickly and in 1120 Pope Callistus II declared that two pilgrimages to his shrine at St David's were equivalent to one to Rome.

Saturday 2 March Feast of St Chad, Bishop, Patron of the Archdiocese of Birmingham

Most of what is known of Chad comes from the writings of the Venerable Bede in his "Ecclesiastical History", written in 731.

St Chad, the Apostle of the Midlands, patron saint of the Archdiocese of Birmingham, was born in Northumbria, one of four brothers, all of whom became priests.

He was educated partly at Lindisfarne under St Aidan and partly in Ireland. He succeeded his brother St Cedd as Abbot of Lastingham in Yorkshire in 664 and became Bishop of Mercia in 669. Wulfhere, first Christian king of Mercia, gave him land to establish his see at Lichfield.

Chad was outstanding for his humility and simplicity of life. He died of the plague on 2 March 672. He was immediately venerated as a saint and his Shrine in the Cathedral of Lichfield was a place of pilgrimage throughout the Middle Ages. The Shrine of St Chad above the High Altar [in Birmingham Cathedral] contains some of his relics which were rescued from Lichfield Cathedral at the reformation
