


SOLEMNITY OF ST GEORGE, MARTYR, PATRON OF ENGLAND

Popular tradition presents St George as the knight who killed the dragon making him a symbol of a triumph of faith against the forces of evil. St George, (303 AD), lived shortly before the First Constantine's reign. He was born into an illustrious family in Cappadocia and at a young age was raised to the ministry during Emperor Diocletian's reign. When the emperor promulgated an edict against the Christians, St George professed his faith publicly, for which he was martyred. During the crusades Richard Coeur de Lion impressed

by the cult of St George, so popular in the east, made St George the Protector of England. He is a patron saint of England, Portugal, Germany, Aragon, Genoa and Venice. His tomb is in Lod, Tel Aviv, Israel.

FEAST OF ST MARK, EVANGELIST

St Mark was one of the four writers of the Gospels. who provide us with a clear account of the life and teaching of Jesus Christ. We know St. Mark, therefore, mostly through his authorship of the second Gospel - the Gospel according to St. Mark. From elsewhere in Scripture, he is also known to have

accompanied Paul and Barnabas on their journeys.

From tradition, he is known to have been the secretary of St. Peter and the founder of the Church in Alexandria, Egypt.
