Archbishop Bernard Longley has written to all parishes in the diocese encouraging us to support CAFOD's emergency appeal for Sudan.

Catholic Agency for The situation in Sudan is deteriorating rapidly and with 25 Overseas Development million people needing immediate humanitarian assistance up to seven million people will now be at risk of famine-like conditions by June.

CAFOD has immediately released £150,000 from their funds to support their local partners, including Caritas Sudan, and there is an urgent need for them to scale up their emergency response.

### **New Auxiliary Bishops**

Prayerful congratulations to Mgr Timothy Menezes, Dean of St Chad's Cathedral, and Canon Richard Walker, Vicar General, who have been appointed by Pope Francis to be new Auxiliary Bishops to serve our Archdiocese. The Bishops of England and Wales have chosen Tuesday of the 5th Week of Easter as the Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse, 30th April 2024. This year's focus is on communities who have been directly affected by allegations or convictions related to abuse – especially, but not exclusively, within the Church. This may be associated with clergy, a teacher in a local school, a leader of a Catholic group or other person or group whose investigation or conviction is likely to affect the wider community.
