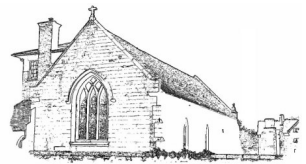

Sunday, June 30, offers everyone an opportunity to help the Pope express his closeness to people who suffer.
