Our annual **SUMMER FETE** will be held in the garden of the Priest's House at St Mary's on **Saturday 5th July from 1.00 until 5.00pm**.


There are many ways in which you can help us raise much needed funds for the parish. One way is to help stock some of the stalls with **DONATED ITEMS** including:
