

PILGRIMAGE TO EVESHAM In this Jubilee of Hope year, parishes are encouraged to make a pilgrimage to one of the sacred spaces designated by the Diocese. On Saturday 13th September we parishioners of St Mary's have the opportunity to join other pilgrims from our Deanery for Mass at 12 noon at The Immaculate Conception & St Egwin Catholic Church, High Street, Evesham. We will travel in our own cars and so it will be good to arrange car shares to take other parishioners who wish to join us. Please add your name/s to the list on the clipboard on the table in the porch if you intend to join this pilgrimage with us.



Legend has it that Our Lady appeared in Evesham to Eof, a swineherd in the 8th C (England's oldest recorded apparition of Our Lady), stating the sanctity of the location and requesting a church to be built in her honour. Soon after she appeared to the Bishop of Worcester, Egwin, in the same location, confirming her request which led to one of the largest Benedictine monasteries of England being built there.

It became an important shrine to Our Lady, and later St Egwin too, with many pilgrims visiting.

Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8

date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8. Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child that will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation and asks for an increase of peace.

Memorial of St Peter Claver, Priest (1580-1654) St Peter Claver was born at Verdu in Catalonia, Spain, and entered the Society of Jesus. In 1610 he was sent to Columbia and began his life's work among the slaves. He cared for them and baptised more than 300,000 during his thirty-three years of tireless ministry.

Memorial of St Egwin, Bishop (717) The foundation of the abbey at Evesham is attributed to an eight century Bishop of Worcester called Egwin.

Memorial of St John Chrysostom, Bishop, Doctor of the Church (349-407) St John was born in Anticoch, he was a great genius, whose powerful eloquence earned him the name Chrysostom, "the golden mouthed". He entered monastic life and then became a priest. As Archbishop of Constantinople, he distinguished himself for his preaching and his abundant writings about Catholic doctrine and Christian life.
