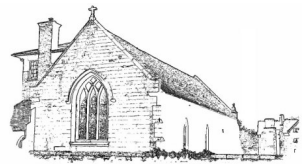

St Mary's parish was pleased to welcome the faithful from across the whole of the Archdiocese to the annual Pilgrimage to Harvington Hall on Sunday 6 September.

Approximately 850 pilgrims made their way to Harvington for the afternoon Mass celebrated in honour of the English Martyrs. The Principal Celebrant this year was His Excellency Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, who was welcomed warmly at the beginning of Mass by The Most Reverend Bernard Longley, Archbishop of Birmingham.

Sunday's event was deemed a great success, made possible by the leadership of the Pilgrimage Committee with support from over fifty volunteers principally drawn from St Marys parish and Harvington Hall, working long before, during and after the event. The Catholic Church has played a pivotal role in establishing education in this country.

The first schools and universities were set up during the sixth century by the Church.

Education remains the largest charitable activity of the Church in this country, with many of our schools established for poor immigrant children in the 19th century. Our forebears rightly saw education as the principal means of handing on the faith and improving the spiritual, moral, social and cultural lives of children and young people.

Since then, the Catholic Church has become the country's largest provider of secondary schools and second-largest provider of primary schools, along with four universities.

Catholic schools continue to be true to their historical mission, in educating substantially more pupils from the most deprived backgrounds than other state-funded schools.
